Taxonomy for the vascular plants follows that used by the Illustrated flora of British Columbia.

This survey was done in a 5 hour period on May 25, 2019. A more thorough survey would probably find many other species. Other species would also be found if surveys were done at other times of the year. There are very few fungi shown, due to the dry conditions.

The number of introduced plants gives a false impression of the site. Most of the area is native vegetation. Almost all these introduced ones are along the road edges, and in disturbed sites.
