FEEDER COUNT INSTRUCTIONS

On Sunday, January 5, 2025 choose a time with a lot of activity at your feeder(s) and/or in your yard or local park. Identify and record the number of *individuals* of each species that you see or hear and of the *period of time* that you spend observing. *Use the checklist to record*. (There will also be multiple teams "out in the field" ID-ing and counting birds within our local CBC "Count Circle" this day)

- → Please observe for *a minimum* of <u>one hour</u> --but you are welcome to do more.
- → It's important to identify the birds <u>correctly</u>. *Please use a* BIRD ID GUIDE.
- → Record each <u>species</u> seen and the *highest* number of <u>individuals</u> of each seen or heard at any <u>one</u> time period. (Note: Try your best not to keep adding the same chickadees, quail, etc. as they revisit the area.—Perhaps just count the highest number of each species seen at one time. Whether you see a lot of birds or very few, this is equally valuable information.)
- → Hawks, owls, gulls, crows or other species attracted to your area due to feeder activity or a water source should be also recorded. Count that hunting Cooper's Hawk or perched crow!
- → Use checklist on reverse side (or download from: <u>www.arrowsmithnats.org</u> to record the *species* and *number* of individual of birds in your yard *and in the immediate area*.
- → If you do see a (rare) bird that is not on the checklist, or a bird that you cannot identify, try to get a photo, and/or draw and write a detailed description of what you saw. Please note details of the bird (size, colour, markings, behaviour, etc.) –Thank you!
